A third World Centre was discussed at a Guiders' conference in Cuba in 1946.  
A site was chosen in Cuernavaca, Mexico.

In 1941, First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt visited Camp Bonnie Brae during the Western Hemisphere Encampment which hosted Girl Scouts and Girl Guides from Puerto Rico, Barbados, Bermuda, **Cuba**, Jamaica, Trinidad, The Islands, Argentina, Brazil, British Honduras, Guatemala, Mexico, Panama Canal Zone, British Guiana, Canada and the United States.

In 1941, the Thinking Day appeal was for the purpose of helping Girl Guiding/Girl Scouting in countries suffering from the effects of the Second World War. Money received for the fund in 1943 included donations from **Cuba** and from Mexico, the first time money had been received from Latin America.
